

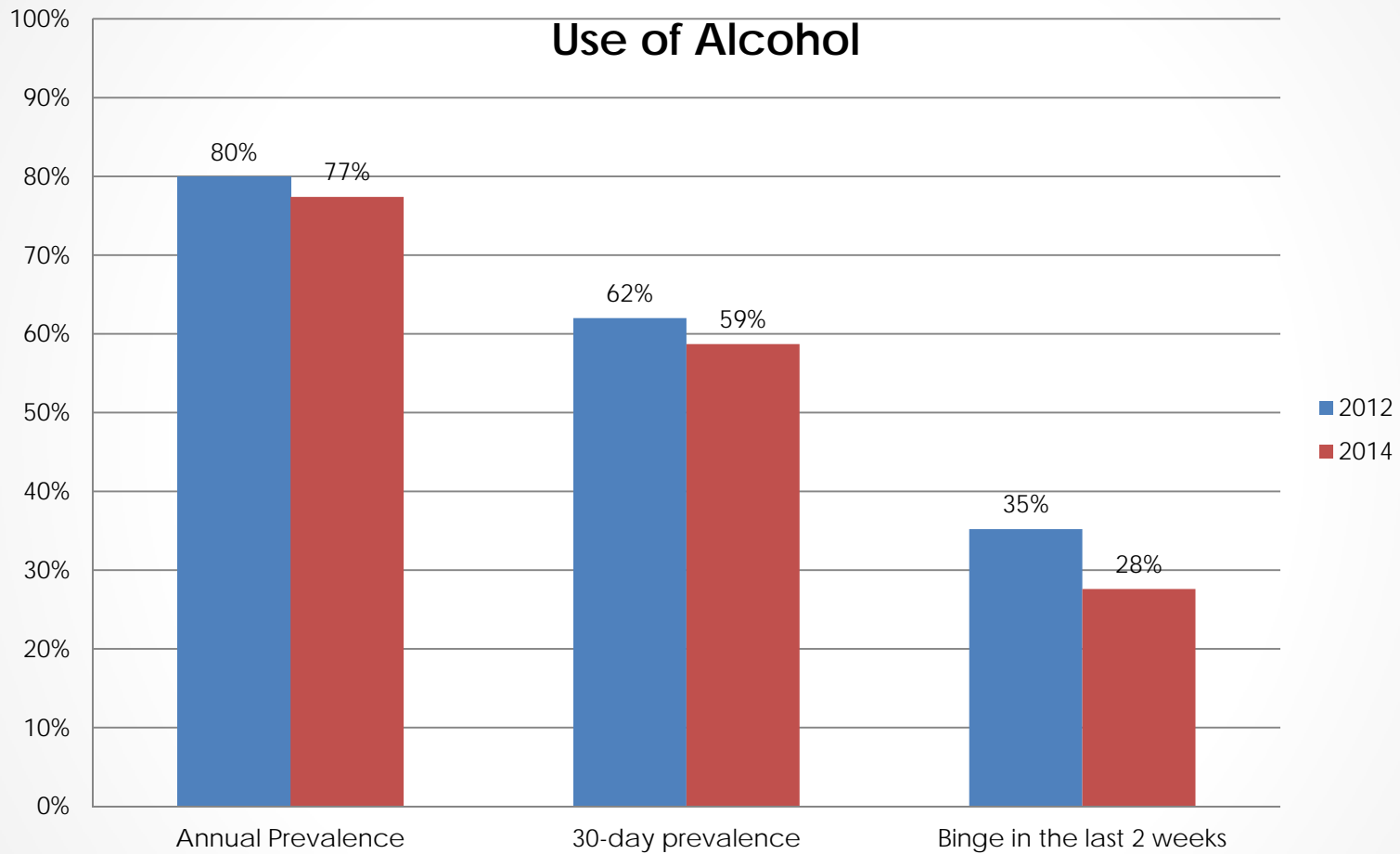
2014 CORE Survey Results

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Respondent Details

- 2012: Number of Surveys = 776
- 2014: Number of Surveys = 578
- CORE Survey was sent via email in the TAMU-CC I-News newsletter to every registered student at TAMU-CC on the following dates in 2014:
 - February 5
 - February 12
 - February 18
 - February 26
 - March 4
 - March 11
- Data was collected from students over the age of 18.
- Three prizes valued at \$300 were awarded to randomly selected survey participants who registered for the drawing.
- The CORE institute within the Southern Illinois University Carbondale Student Health Center developed a report package of the survey findings.

Use of Alcohol at TAMU-CC

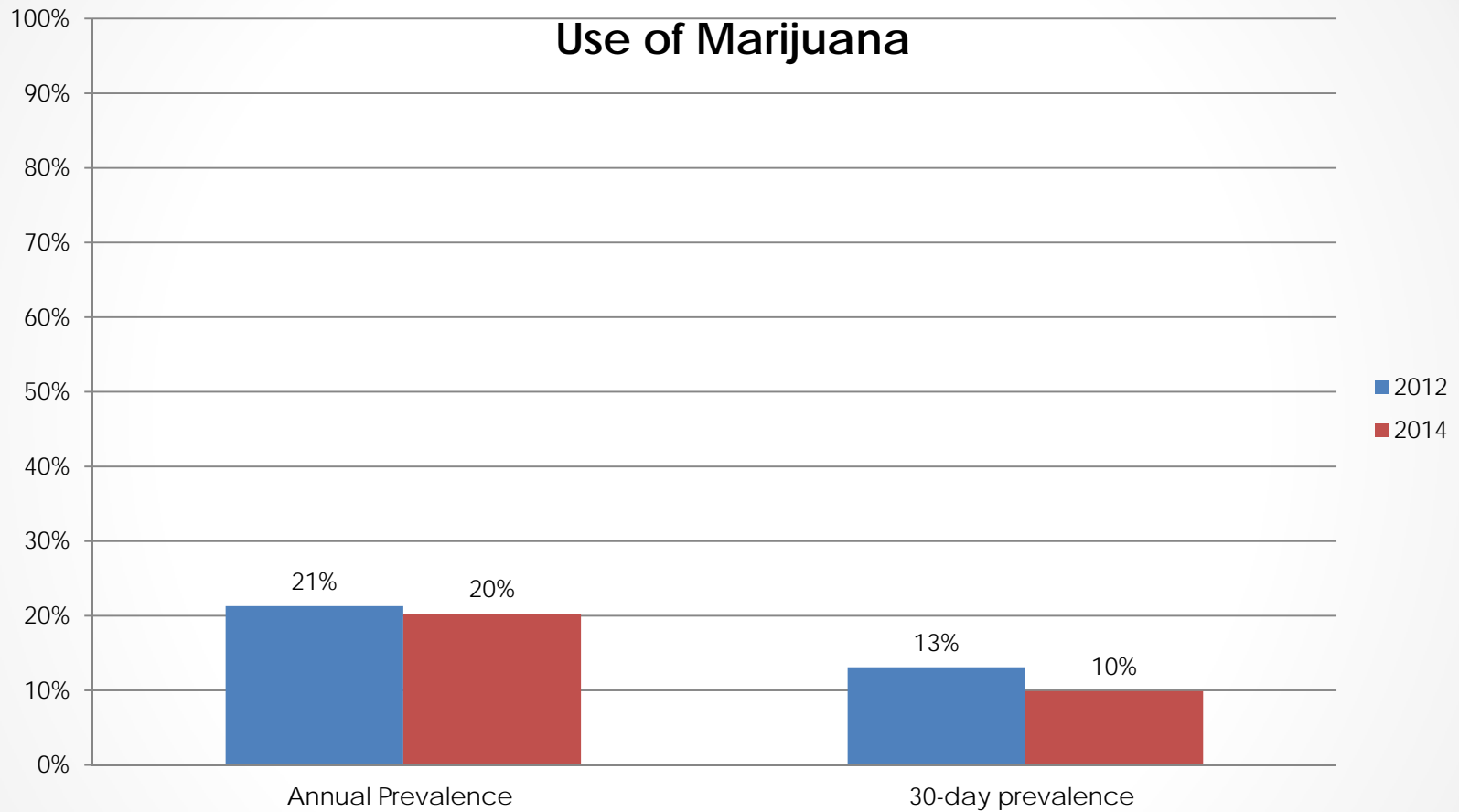


Annual Prevalence- consumed alcohol in the past year.

30-Day Prevalence- consumed alcohol in the past 30 days

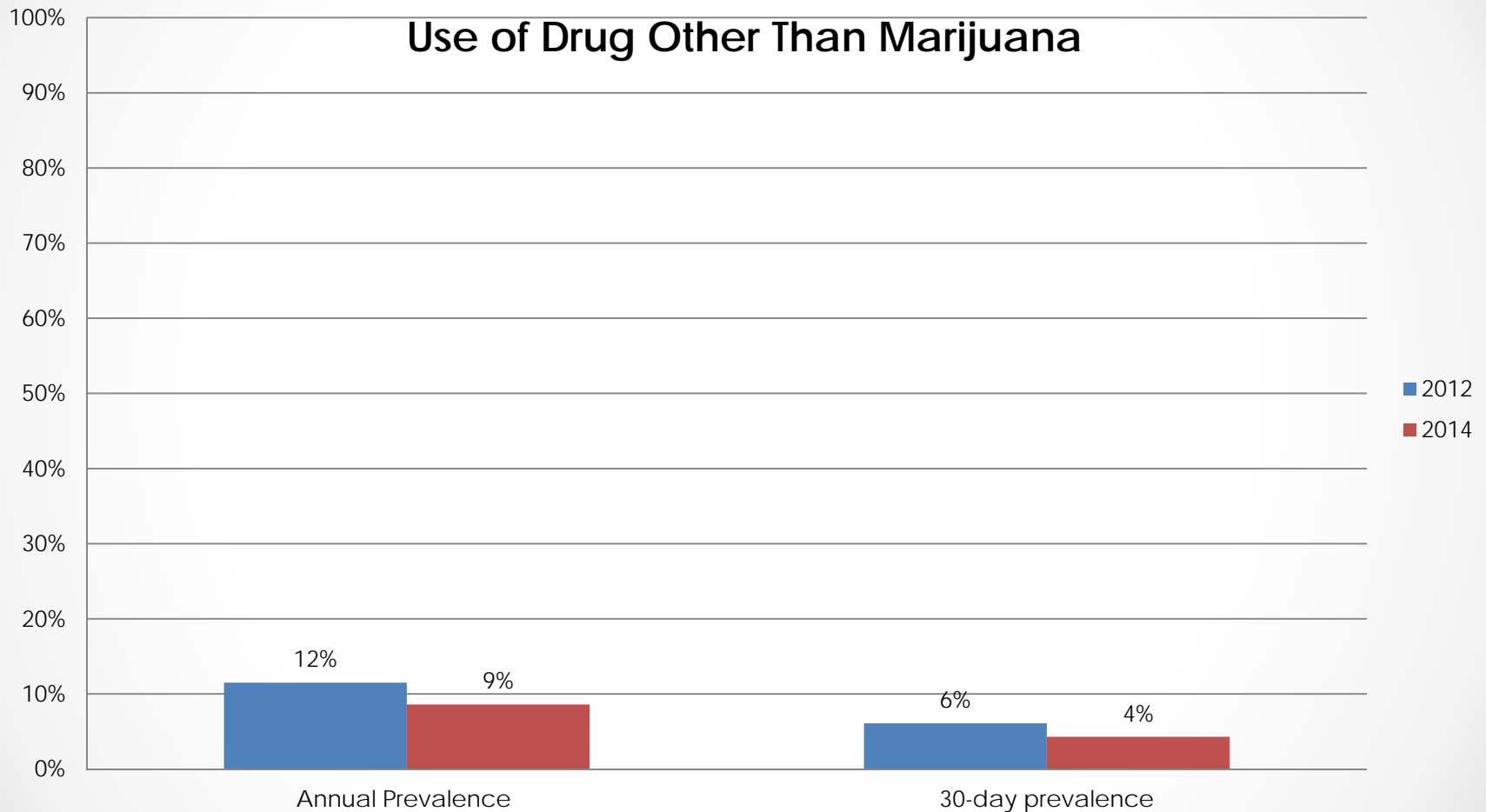
Binge in the last 2 weeks- drinking 5 or more drinks in one sitting in the previous two weeks.

Annual Prevalence- used marijuana in the past year.
30-Day Prevalence- current marijuana user

Use of Other Illegal Drugs

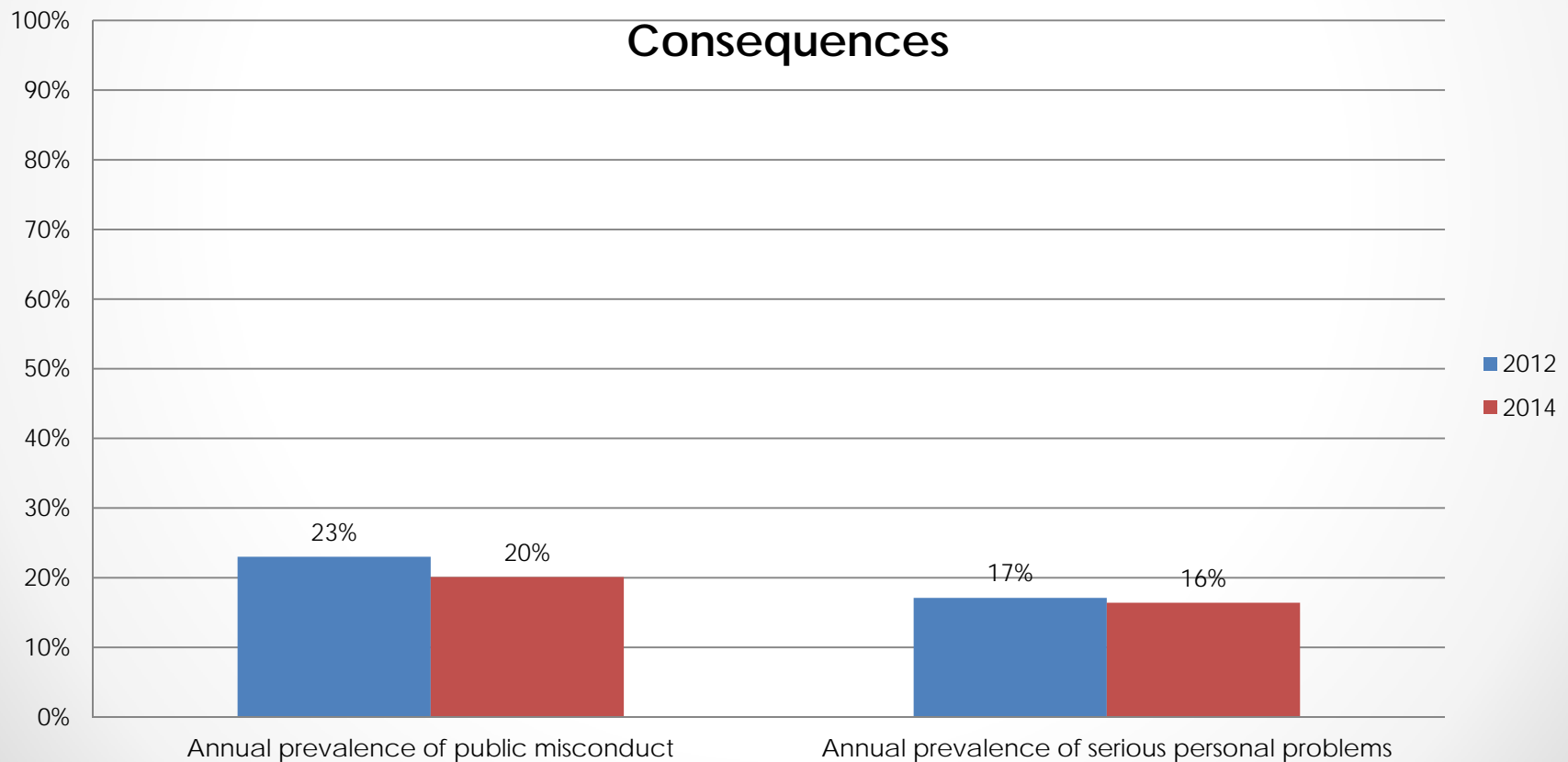


Annual Prevalence- used an illegal drug other than marijuana in the past year.

Consequences of Alcohol and Drug Use

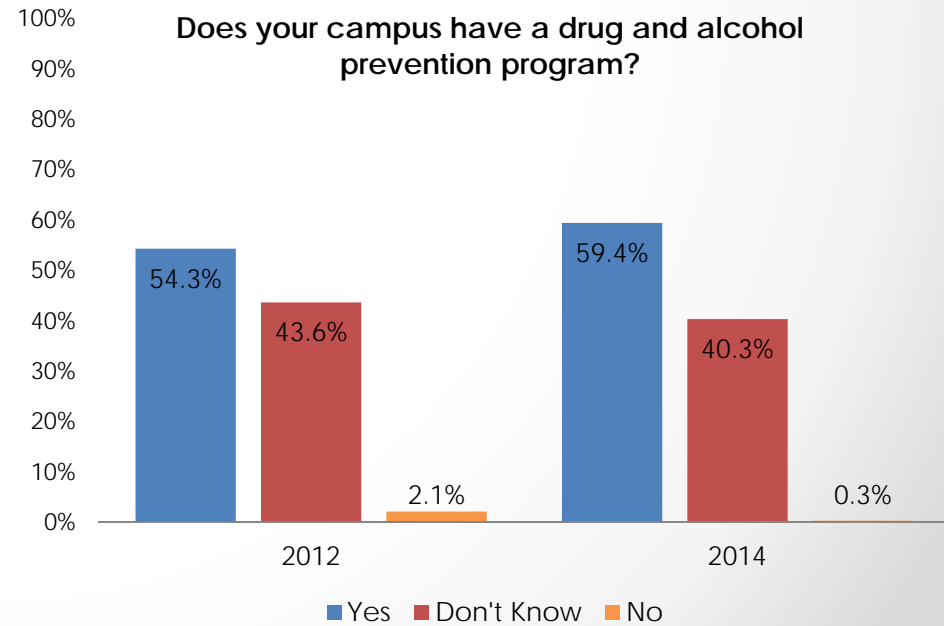
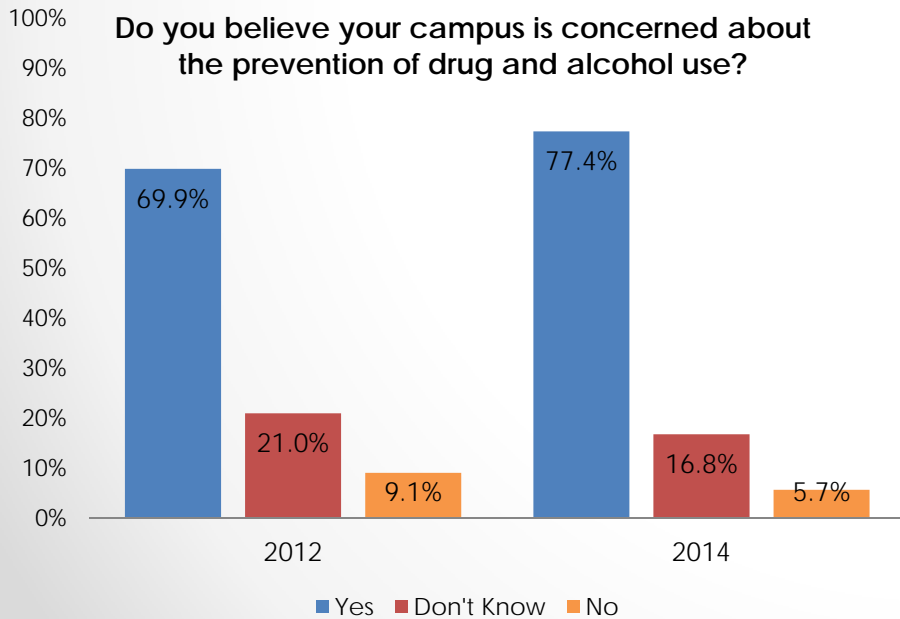
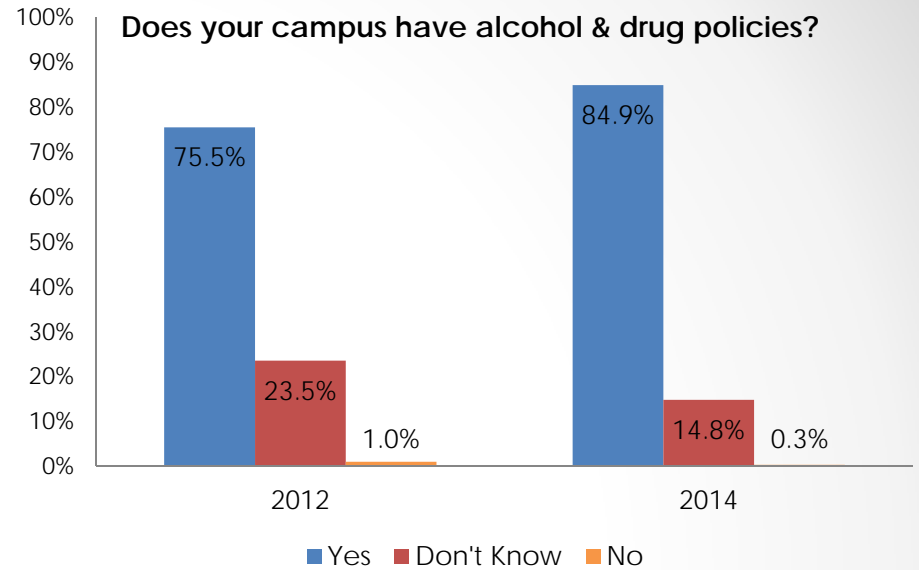
Public Misconduct is defined as trouble with police, fighting/argument, DWI/DUI, or vandalism at least once during the past year as a result of drinking or drug abuse

Serious Problem is defined as suicidality, being hurt or injured, trying unsuccessfully to stop using, and sexual assault at least once during the past year as a result of drinking or drug use.

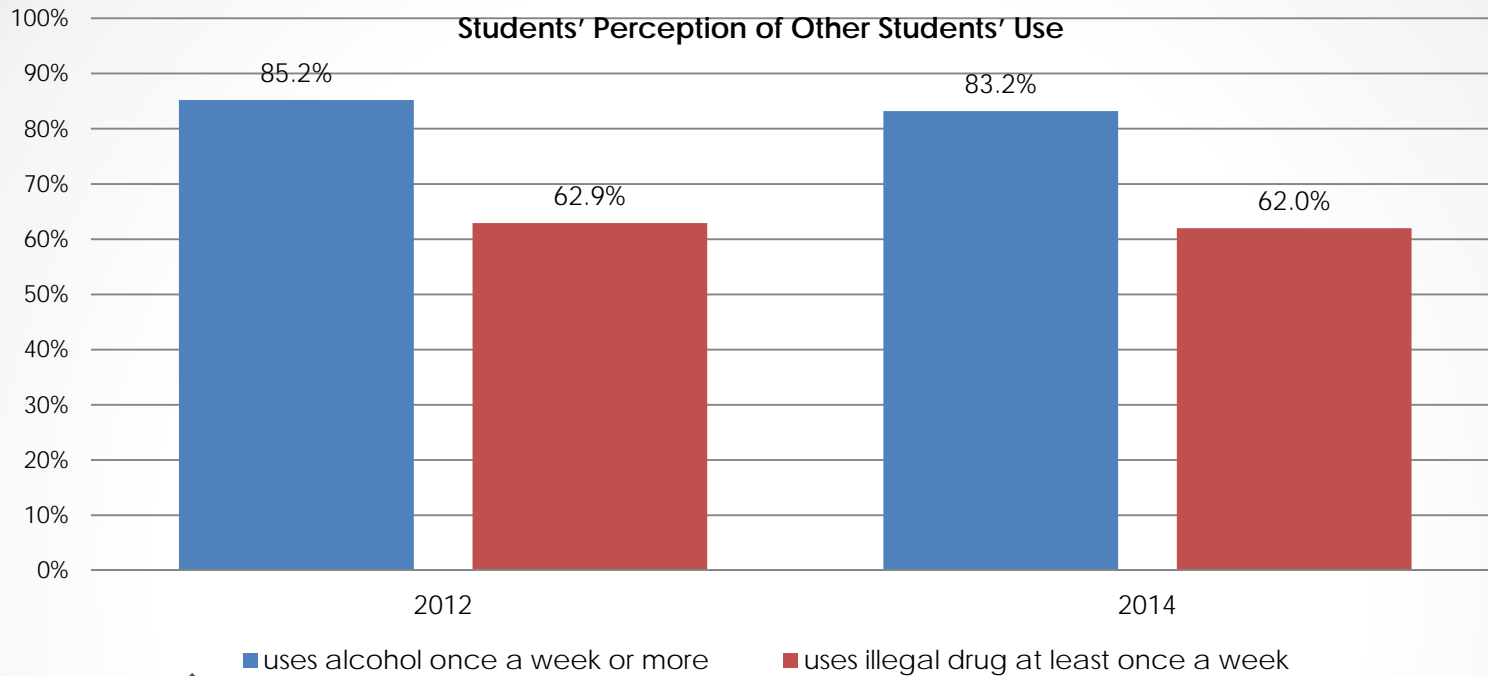


Opinions About Campus Environment

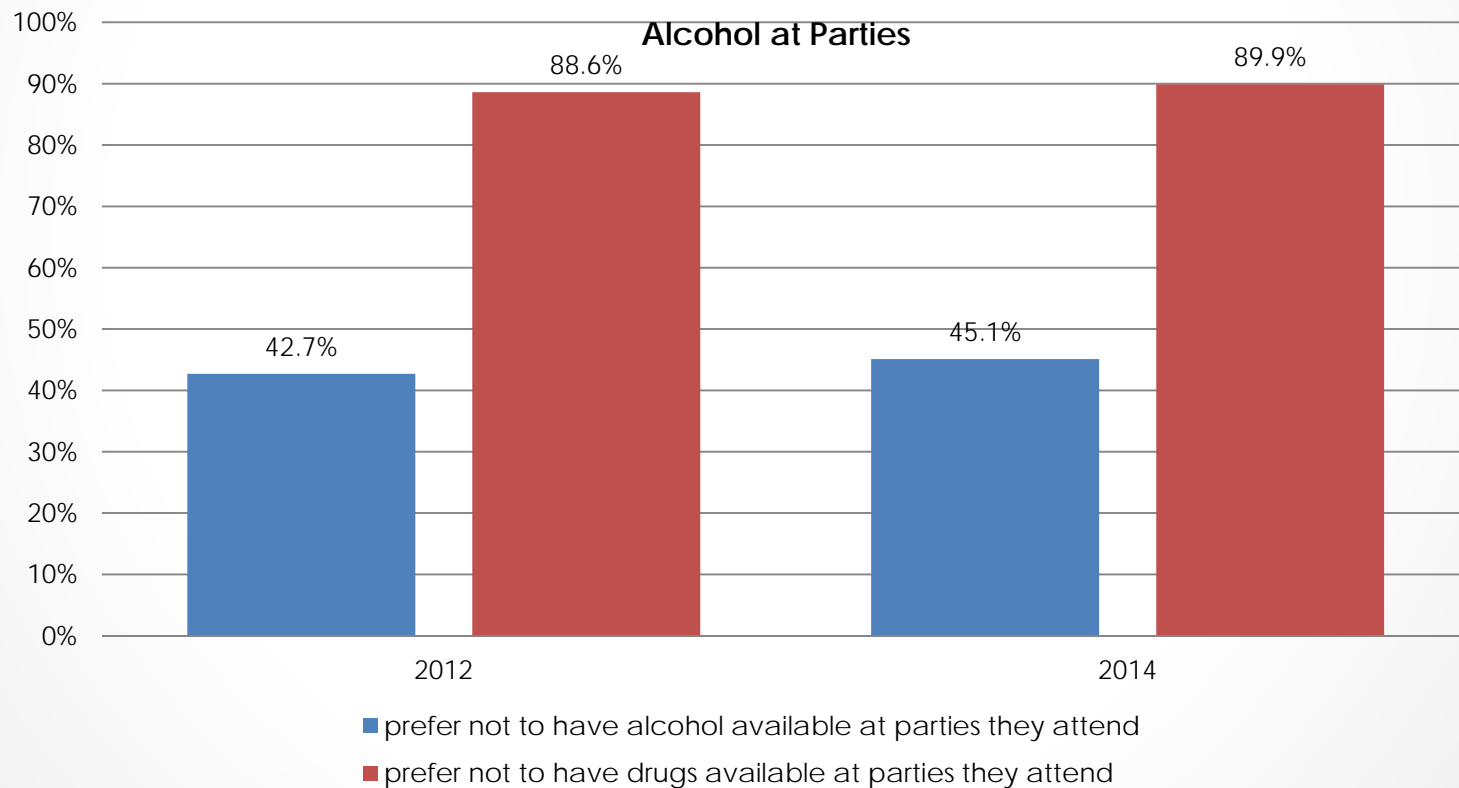

The following graph provides details about students' reported preference on drug and alcohol availability at parties they attend.



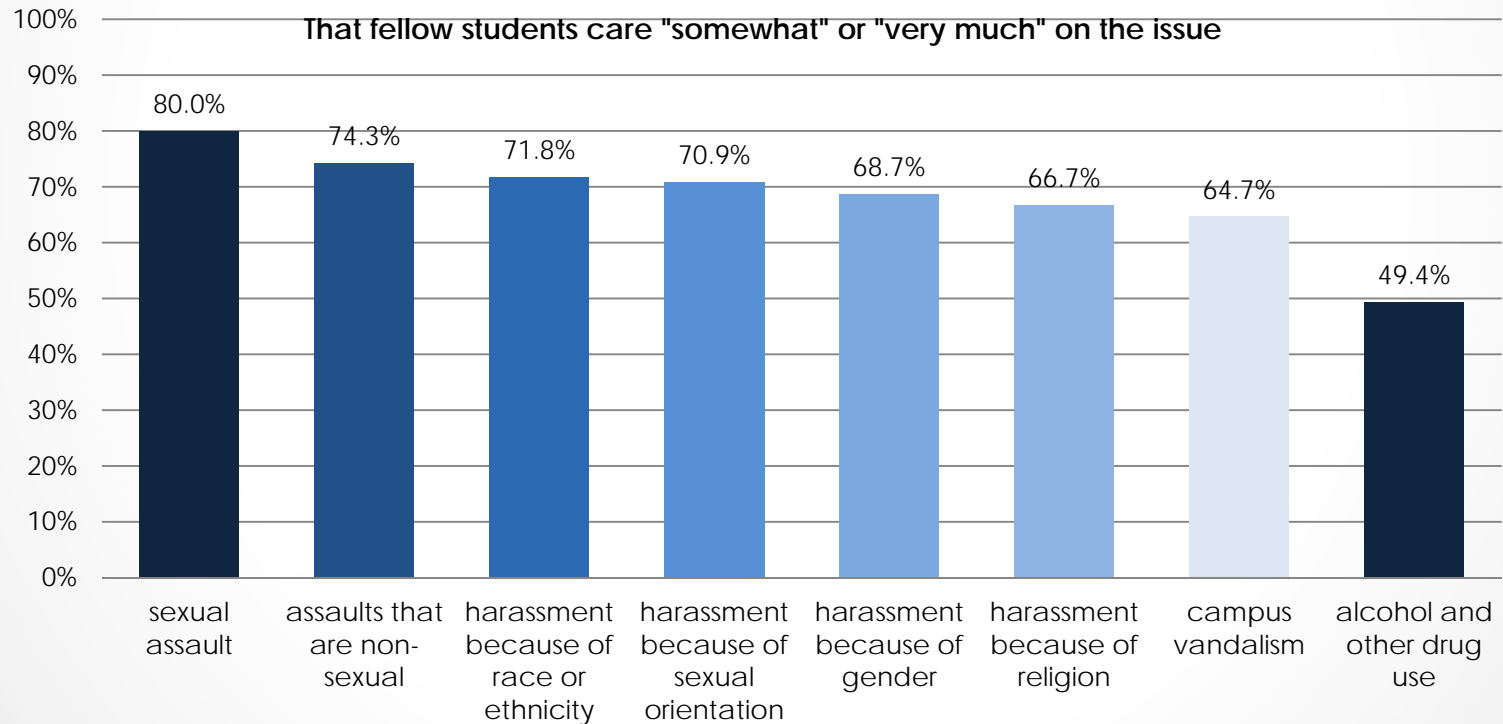

Campus Climate Issues

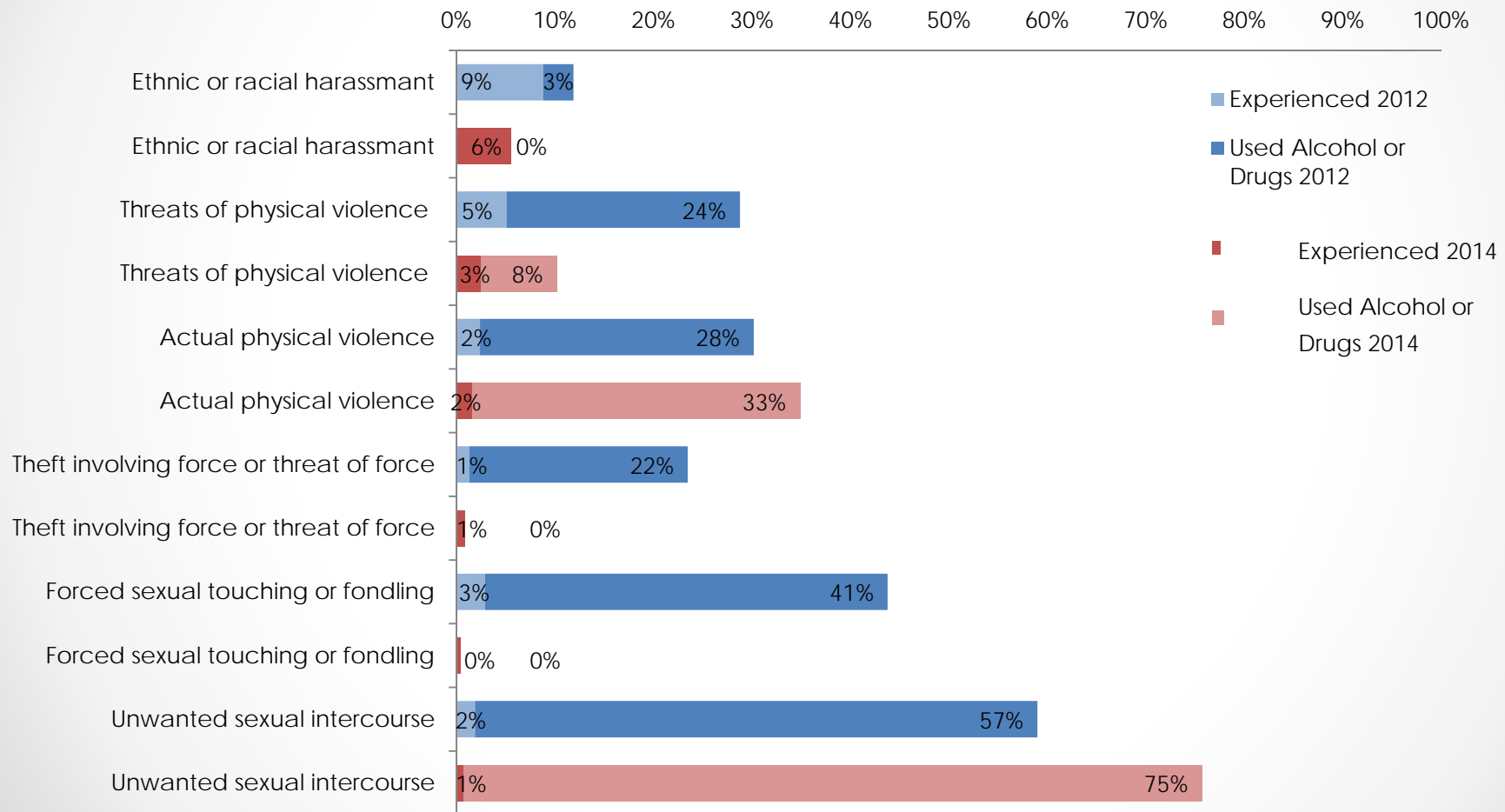

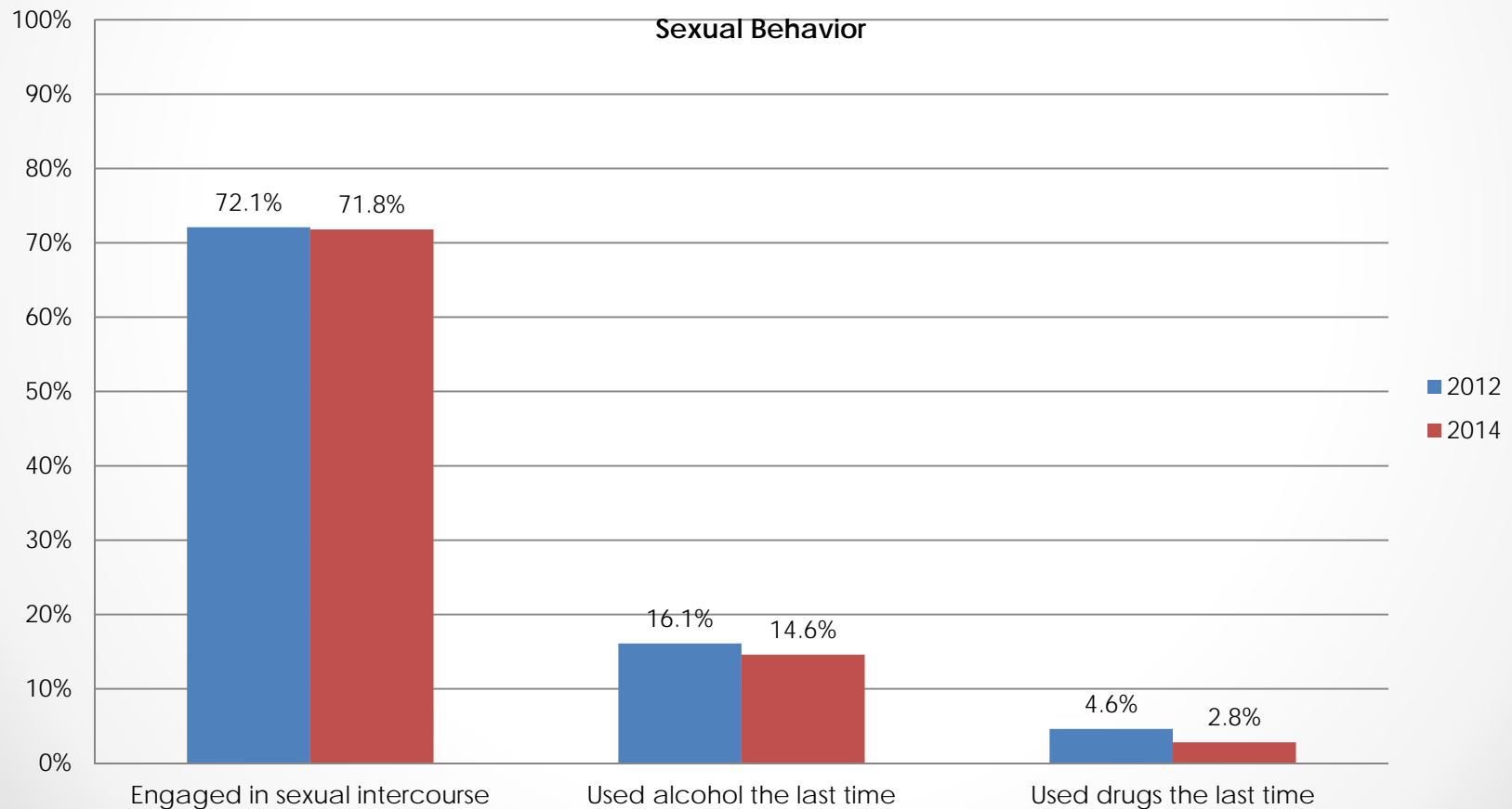
Experiences of Harassment or Violence

The following table shows the percentage of students who reported having experienced any of the following within the last year and, if so, the percentage who reported consuming alcohol or other drugs shortly before these incidents.



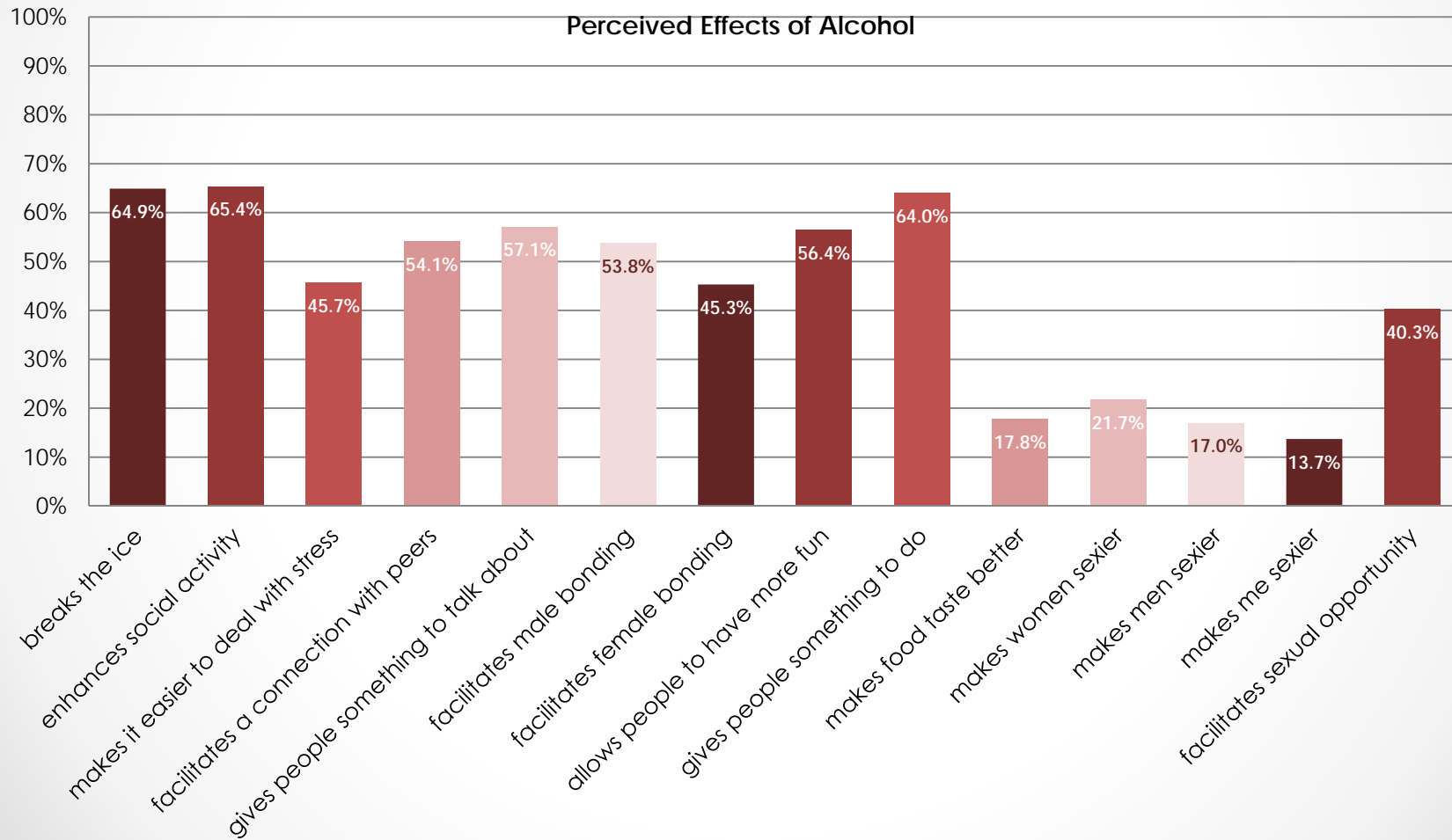
Sexual Behavior

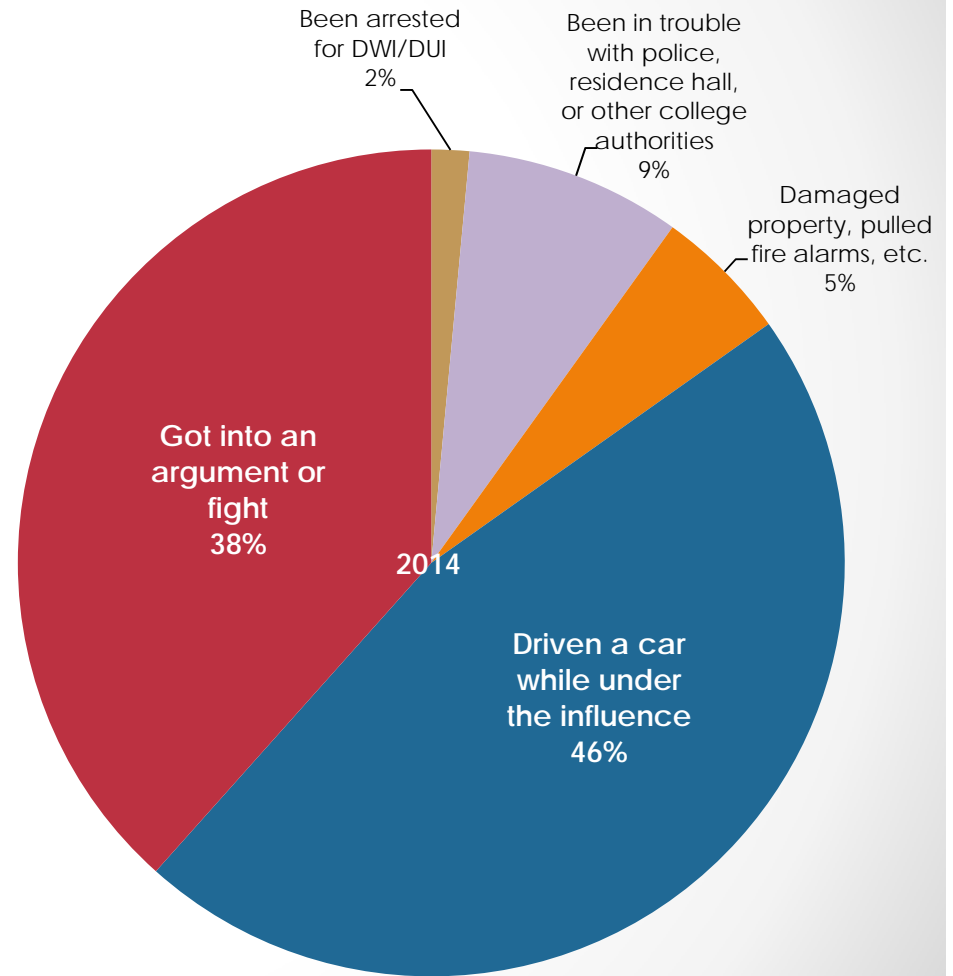
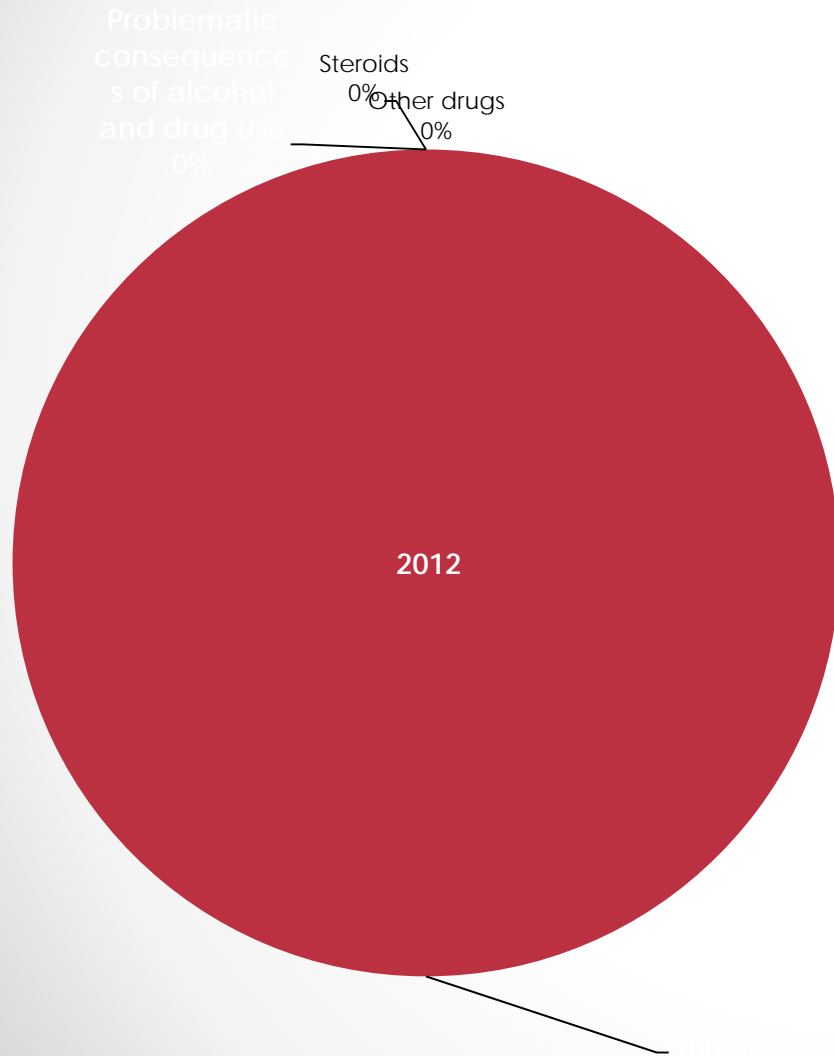

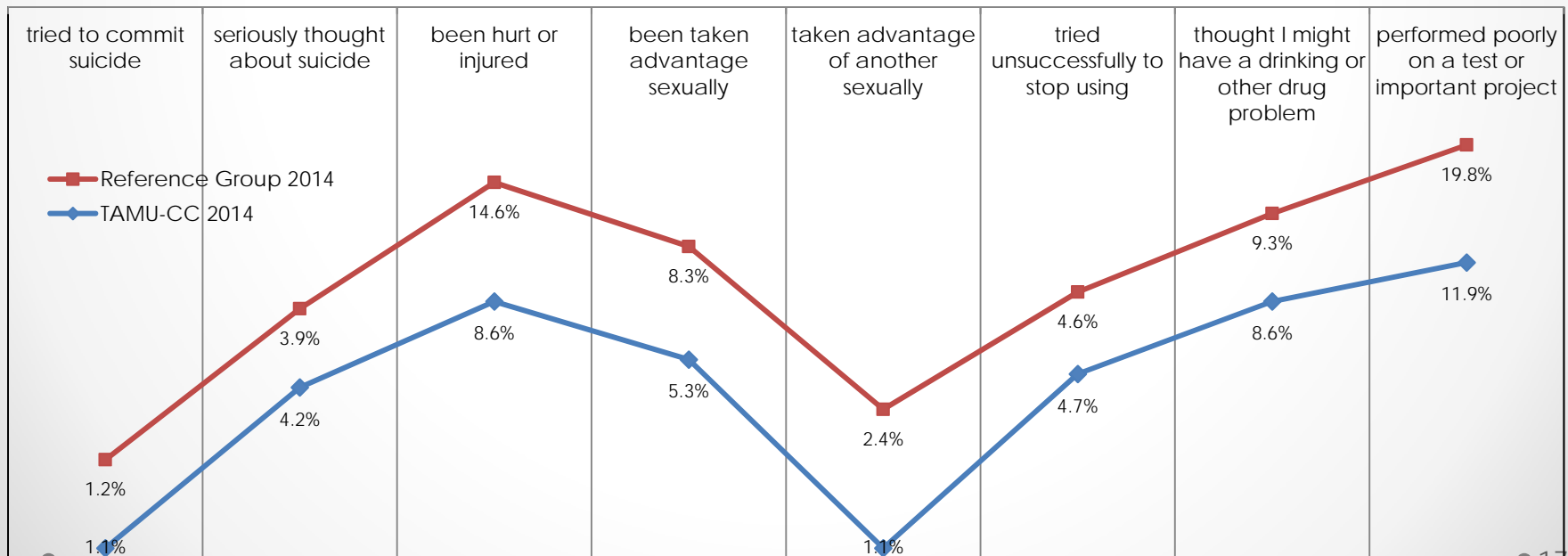
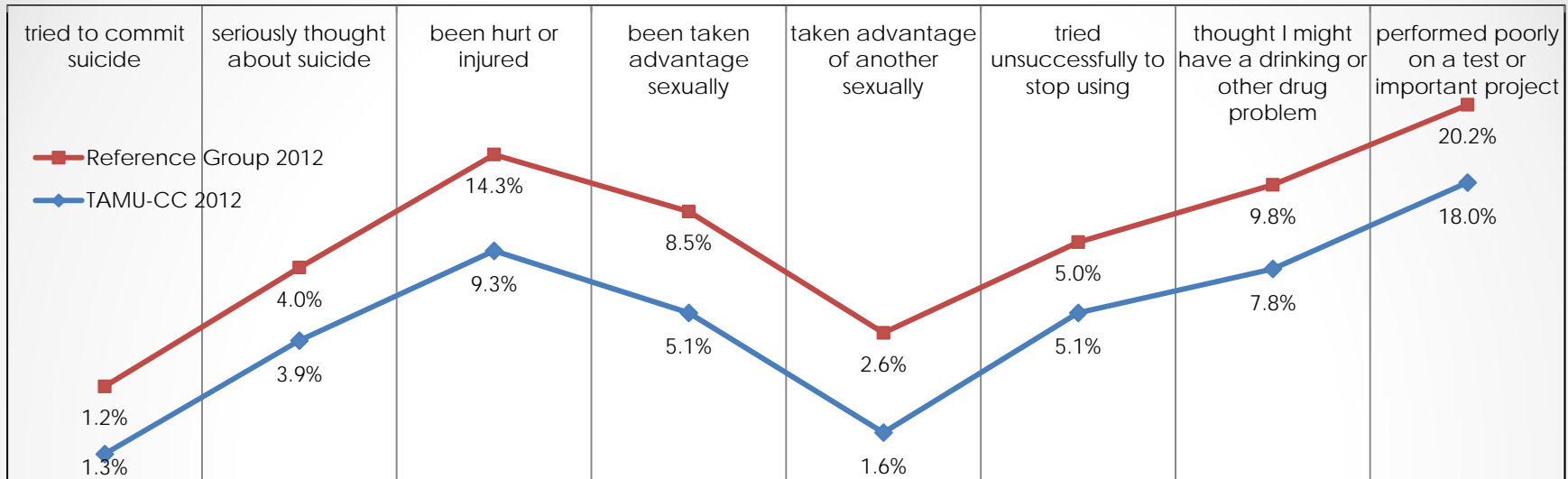
